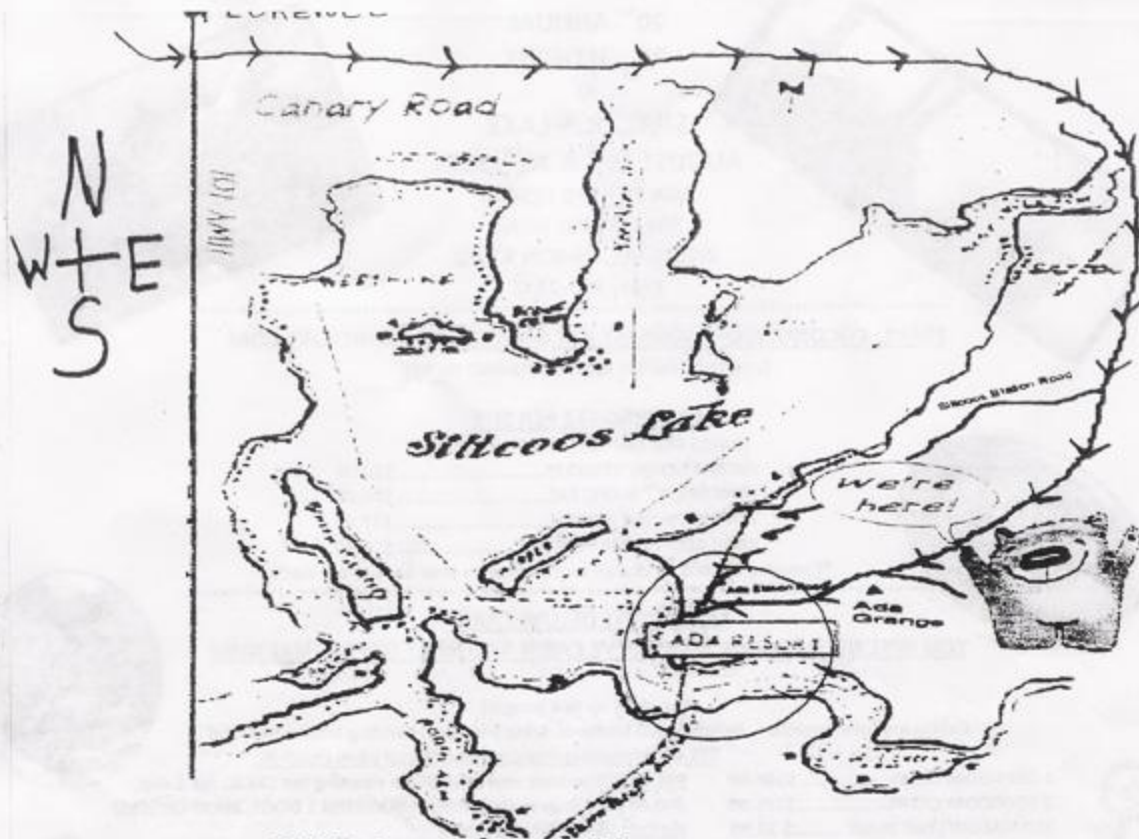

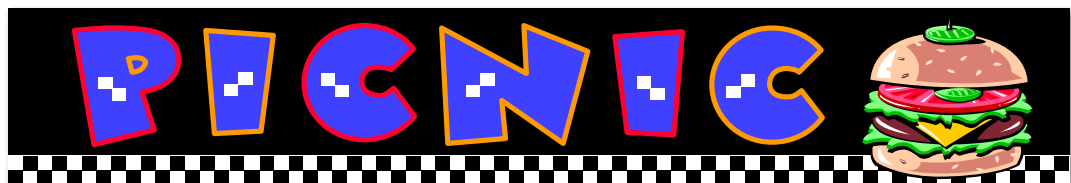

If you do not want to go rafting and do want to go to BBQ, you can pay Karen Dalbec at the BBQ - it is \$1 per person.

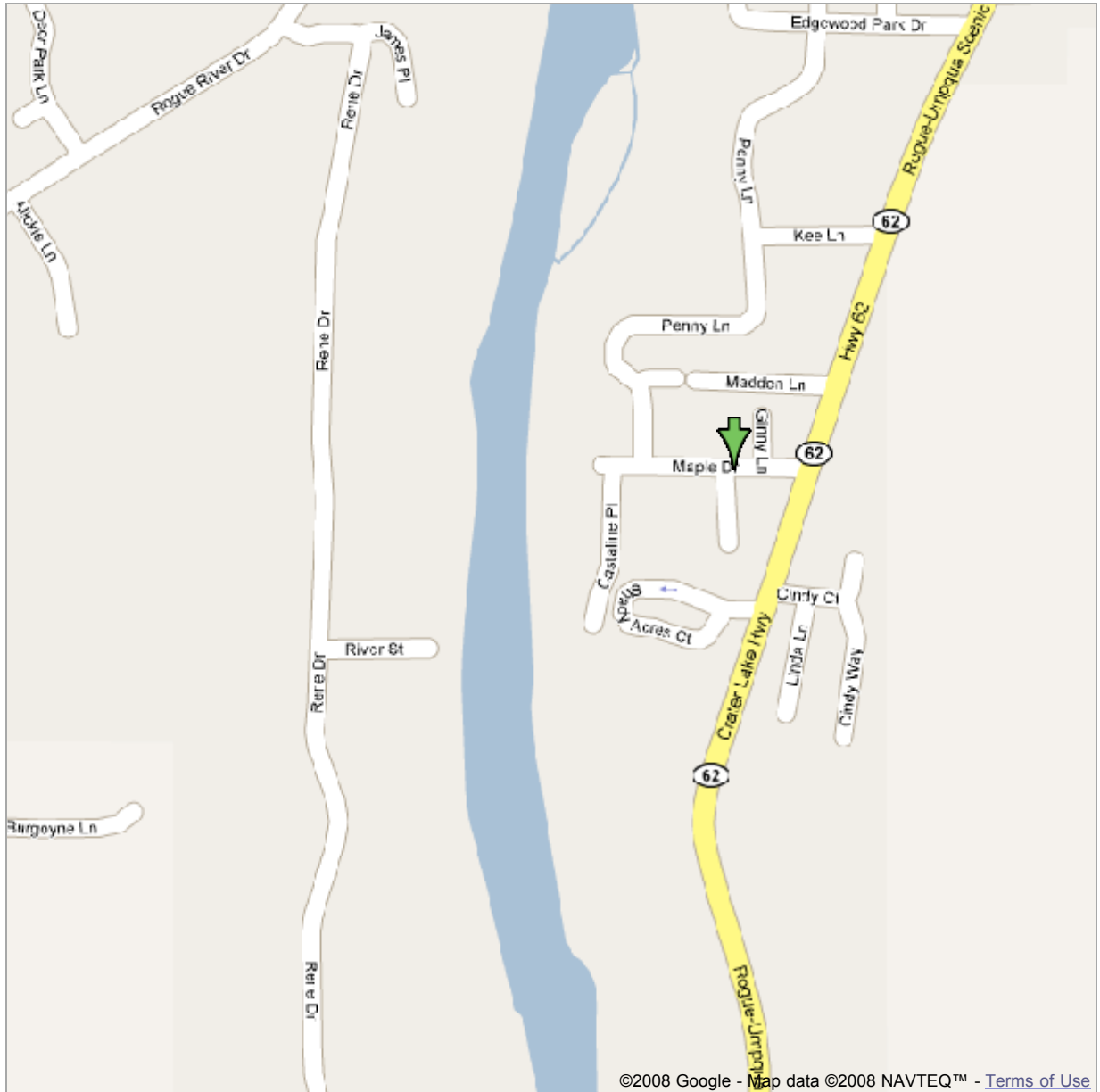
